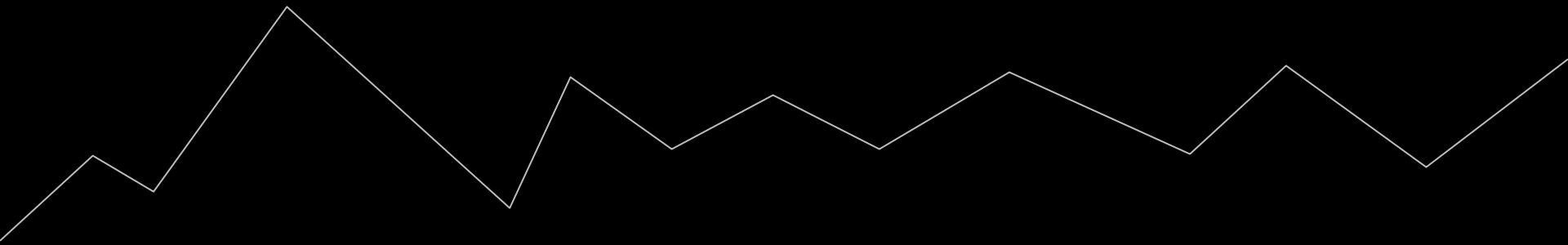


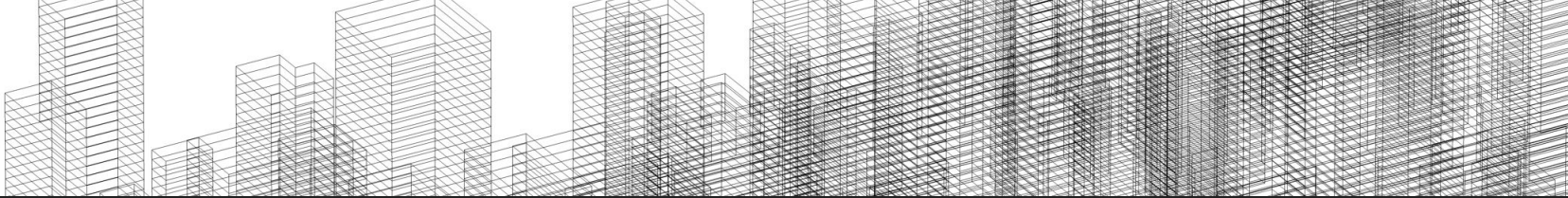

<p>Radical collaboration - more and more happening and much more recognised to be needed. Collaboration between unlikely actors. Pre-competitive collaboration.</p>	<p>High aspirations, little systemic action - no idea how to get there, systems change is needed and still too much faith is free market capitalism. Net zero emissions demand revolution.</p>	<p>Scale and Replication - we are beyond pilot projects or best practices now. The talk is how to scale good projects, whether supply chain, energy or ecosystem restoration.</p>
<p>People at the centre - Indigenous and traditional communities at centre, given more space and support and general consensus that they are the ones holding it together.</p>	<p>Nature as key player - Nature based solutions (NBS) are in the spotlight. What are the regenerative strategies within the nature based solutions? Monoculture forest counts as nature based solutions.</p>	<p>Diversity of humans - Equator Prize happens every 2 years. <p>Impact of a summer of activism - Both in the country's ambitions and in the corporate sector, Schools strikes and Extinction Rebellion had a huge impact. "Effect of the summer on the CEO", Nestlé.</p>	<p>Investment is the sticking point - it seems to be the barrier to landscape management and regenerative business models. Need patient money. Nature cannot be used as collateral for lending.</p>	<p>It's all about landscapes - multi-stakeholder collaboration on integrated landscape management key for regenerative development with people at the centre. Watersheds, biodiversity corridors...</p>

UN OUTCOMES

CLIMATE ACTION SUMMIT COMMITMENTS

- Germany committed to net zero by 2050.
- Norway, UK, Germany and France doubled their commitment to the Green Climate Fund. 12 new countries pledged money.
- India pledged to increased RE capacity to 174GW by 2022
- China made huge commitments NBS.
- EU announced 25% of their next budget to climate related activities.
- Russia ractified Paris Agreement.
- Pakistan, 10 billion trees in the next 5 years.

Call out for investment data. Return on investment on regenerative projects.



Nature Based Solutions

- \$100/tonne of Co₂, cheaper than energy.
- \$1 trillion to Nature Based Solutions in 10 years to provide 37% of emission reduction target.
- 30x more money flowing into degenerative solutions than regenerative. 1% of capital invested.

“I left NYC feeling we are on the verge of having a major political breakthrough on regenerative thinking, policy commitments and dare I say it funding.”

“I would really love some large regenerative landscape scale projects where people are happy to open the bonnet on funding, cost, social and environmental impacts but... with a clear return on investment figure. I can tell you this for each type of renewables but not on different types of regenerative projects. I know many of you keep this as commercially confidential, many impact investors like to keep this secret but politically we need these examples as I am increasingly being asked by policy makers.”

Funding

Funding opportunities to scale work

- [Global Environment Facility](#): Connection to the community director who can introduce to new private sector folk. Billions specially for least development countries. New GEF-7 replenished. Launched [Global Commons Alliance](#)
- [Green Climate Fund](#): partnership with BINGOs. Some higher integrity than others.
- [IKEA Foundation](#): £200 million a year, £300 million committed to Climate Change. New regenerative agriculture focus. Possible partnerships. Re:Fund team to go meet their team. Amsterdam based. They had a fund for shifting humanitarian work towards long-term and sustainability.
- [ICV Group](#) - 7,000 investors and family offices. Regenerosity speaking with them.
- [UNDP/GEF small grants programme](#): <24,000 projects funded. \$25k avg.

Global Landscapes Forum

- Consult with countries and key stakeholders on the content and focus of the UN Decade on Ecosystem Restoration 2021 – 2030;
- Raise awareness of the opportunities linked to large-scale ecosystem restoration in the landscapes and seascapes;
- Forge and announce new, non-traditional partnerships ahead of the implementation of the UN Decade;
- Coordinate and increase international, national, and private support for ecosystem restoration;
- Explore in-depth key global ecosystem restoration needs: forests/agriculture, wetlands/peatlands, mountains, drylands/rangelands, oceans/coasts;
- Strengthen, expand and connect existing restoration initiatives on land and in water from local to global level to accelerate implementation at unprecedented scale.

More focused on sustainable development rather than humanitarian.

We should engage and be at their events.
