CLIMATE ACTION SUMMIT COMMITTMENTS

- Germany committed to net zero by 2050.
- Norway, UK, Germany and France doubled their commitment to the Green Climate Fund. 12 new countries pledged money.
- India pledged to increased RE capacity to 174GW by 2022
- China made huge commitments NBS.
- EU announced 25% of their next budget to climate related activities.
- Russia ractified Paris Agreement.
- Pakistan, 10 billion trees in the next 5 years.

Call out for investment data. Return on investment on regenerative projects.



- \$100/tonne of Co2, cheaper than energy.
- \$1 trillion to Nature Based Solutions in 10 years to provide 37% of emission reduction target.
- 30x more money flowing into degenerative solutions than regenerative. 1% of capital invested.

"I left NYC feeling we are on the verge of having a major political breakthrough on regenerative thinking, policy commitments and dare I say it funding."

"I would really love some large regenerative landscape scale projects where people are happy to open the bonnet on funding, cost, social and environmental impacts but... with a clear return on investment figure. I can tell you this for each type of renewables but not on different types of regenerative projects. I know many of you keep this as commercially confidential, many impact investors like to keep this secret but politically we need these examples as I am increasingly being asked by policy makers."



Funding opportunities to scale work

- Global Environment Facility: Connection to the community director who can introduce to new private sector folk. Billions specially for least development countries. New GEF-7 replenished. Launched Global Commons Alliance
- Green Climate Fund: partnership with BINGOs. Some higher integrity than others.
- <u>IKEA Foundation:</u> £200 million a year, £300 million committed to Climate
 Change. New regenerative agriculture focus. Possible partnerships. Re:Fund
 team to go meet their team. Amsterdam based. They had a fund for shifting
 humanitarian work towards long-term and sustainability.
- <u>ICV Group</u> 7,000 investors and family offices. Regenerosity speaking with them.
- <u>UNDP/GEF small grants programme</u>: <24,000 projects funded. \$25k avg.

Global Landscapes Forum

- Consult with countries and key stakeholders on the content and focus of the UN Decade on Ecosystem Restoration 2021 2030;
- Raise awareness of the opportunities linked to large-scale ecosystem restoration in the landscapes and seascapes;
- Forge and announce new, non-traditional partnerships ahead of the implementation of the UN Decade;
- Coordinate and increase international, national, and private support for ecosystem restoration;
- Explore in-depth key global ecosystem restoration needs: forests/agriculture, wetlands/peatlands, mountains, drylands/rangelands, oceans/coasts;
- Strengthen, expand and connect existing restoration initiatives on land and in water from local to global level to accelerate implementation at unprecedented scale.

Interesting Stuff at GLF

- <u>Landscale</u>: measuring performance and communicating sustainability at landscape level.
- <u>Muvuca</u>: traditional indigenous reforestation method in the Amazon. 16x more trees for 2-3x less cost.
- Agroforestry Indigenous Cacao: typhoon-resilient crops, 100,000 tonnes shortage of supply.
- Global evergreening alliance: green up to cool down. Massive green wall in Africa.
